Indefinite Articles a, an

Definite Article the

This special class is based on your end semester exam question papers from the year 2012 to 2017.

We'll first have a look at each blank space for an article in a question, and then I shall try to illustrate its correct usage in English.

I want _____ pen and _____

umbrella. (2012, 2013)

I want **a** pen and **an** umbrella.

Use 'a' before a consonant sound and 'an' before a vowel sound.

Remember, it is the *sound*, and *not the letter*, that matters in this context.

There is _____ hourly bus service on this route. (2016)

There is <u>an</u> hourly bus service on this route. (2016)

Use 'an' if the initial 'h' is mute.

More examples of words

beginning with a silent 'h':

heir, heiress, heirloom, honest, honesty, honorary, honorarium, hour, etc.

Babul's sister is _____ M.A. in Philosophy. (2017)

Babul's sister is <u>an</u> M.A. in Philosophy. (2017)

Use 'an' if the initial sound of an abbreviation is that of a vowel.

More examples:

an M.B.A. degree, an L.P. school, an R.C.C. house, an N.C.C. officer, etc.

My friend Arthur is _____ European. (2017)

My friend Arthur is a European.

If the initial sound of a word is like 'yu', which is a consonant sound, use 'a' before it.

More examples: university, Europe, uniform, union, unique, Unitarian, united, universal, usual, etc.

I found _____ one-rupee coin on the road. (2016)

I found **a** one-rupee coin on the road.

Even when the first letter of a word is a vowel, use 'a' if it produces a consonant sound like 'wa'.

More examples:

- This is **a** One-Act play.
- He is <u>a</u> one-eyed man.
- This is **a** one-way street.

____ sixth chapter of this

book is very interesting. (2017)

The sixth chapter of this book is very interesting.

Use 'the' when you specifically and very clearly refer to a particular person or object.

e.g.

- I want **the** book, and not a book.
- He swore revenge on <u>the</u> man who had killed his father.

- Krishna and _____
 Kaveri are two big rivers in the South. (2012)
- She reads _____ Gita every day. (2013)

- The Krishna and the Kaveri are two big rivers in the South.
 (2012)
- She reads <u>the</u> Gita every day.
 (2013)

- Use 'the' before the names of rivers.
- Use 'the' before the names of holy books.

- It was _____ event that surprised ____ scientific world. (2012, 2014)
- We met _____ Englishman and _____ Japanese _____ other day. _____ Japanese wore _____ red shirt. (2014)
- Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay were _____ first to conquer Everest in ____ year 1953. (2014)

- It was <u>an</u> event that surprised <u>the</u> scientific world.
- We met <u>an</u> Englishman and <u>a</u>
 Japanese <u>the</u> other day. <u>The</u>
 Japanese wore <u>a</u> red shirt.
- Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay were <u>the</u> first to conquer Everest in <u>the</u> year 1953.

Saswati was adjudged ______best debater. (2016)

Saswati was adjudged **the** best debater.

Use 'the' before the superlative adjectives.

More examples:

the hardest, the brightest, the most beautiful, the least expensive, etc.
